Change of mobile numbers/change of address:

Can we ask you to kindly keep us up-to-date with any changes in your mobile numbers or address so that we can note these on your registration form. This also includes any family member/friends on the authorised to collect list. Sometimes it is necessary to contact you, especially in an emergency, so its important that we have the correct information on file.

Also, if for any reason you are unable to collect your child, we can release to a person not on your list, as long as you notify the setting and provide that person with the password we hold for you.

We would like to welcome Chloe Dillnutt to our Pre-school team. Chloe, in her short time at the setting, has become a popular member of staff who has displayed excellent skills in her interactions with the children and we are delighted that she has joined our Team.

Mandy has been a member of staff for well over 30 years and we appreciate the commitment she has shown in that time to supporting the learning and development of so many children. We will miss Mandy's wisdom, experience, drawing skills and dedication to the setting, but wish her well in the next exciting chapter of her life.

Transition to Primary Education in September 2024/PE Kits:

At this time of the year, we support children to make the transition to primary education. We like to encourage them to be able to be independent in their own self-help skills and will therefore be changing for PE every day for the next couple of weeks. Can we ask you to provide an extra pair of trainers, shorts and T-shirts in a named bag so that we can practice changing for PE. We then intend to have a variety of games and races on the school field. The younger children do not need a change of clothes but will still join in our PE activities.

Teaching Children How to be Safe On-line:

This week our focus of learning is about being safe on-line. Children loving using technology such as iPads and smartphones from a young age. Children however need to be supported in these environments to get the best out of using the internet right from the start.

Creating a family agreement is a useful way to establish your expectations in remaining safe online such as agreeing time limits on using technology, placing or using computers/tablets in a busy part of the house and removing portable devices from your child's bedroom at night to avoid tiredness. Education is also the best tool we have in ensuring our children remain safe online so its important to encourage your child to say if something or someone upsets them on line.

We have been reading Chicken Clicking this week which uses a story to remind children that 'friends' made online are still strangers. There are also a series of books on Childnet, a UK-based charity working in partnership with others around the world to help make the internet a great and safe place for children and young people, called Digiduck.
